FEATURED SAINT: Saint Joan of Arc

Born: 6th January c. 1412 / Died: 30th May 1431

St Joan of Arc nicknamed "The Maid of Orleans". A national heroine of France, acting under divine guidance at age 18 she led the French army to victory over the English at Orleans. Captured a year late, Joan was burned at the stake as heretic by the English and their French collaborators. The Church reversed its decision in 1455, and she was canonized in 1920. Joan was born to a propertied peasant family at Domrémy in northeast France. In 1428, she requested to be taken to Charles, later testifying that she was guided by visions from the archangel Michael, Saint Margaret, and Saint Catherine to help him save France from English domination.
