FROM THE PRINCIPAL ...

Ngā mihi o te wā ki a koutou! A wintry greeting to you all!

As I reflect on how I have spent my time in recent weeks I'm struck by the time I've spent working with children exploring and unpacking incidents which have caused harm - a wide range of incidents, from not sharing or saying nasty things to fighting and physical assault. Naturally of course it will happen that some of my time is spent supporting or investigating when things go wrong. People are dynamic, children perhaps moreso, and when we interact with others there is always potential for things to play out differently to what we might like. At our school we work really hard to apply a Catholic perspective to all of what we do all of the time. When things go wrong, we use a restorative approach to consider harm that may occur as a result of our decisions or actions and to explore ways in which we can repair that harm and restore right relationships - Pope Francis reminds us that we exist in 4 key relationships at all times; with God, self, others and creation. Sometimes we get this right and individuals and relationships flourish as a result. At the heart of this work is a desire to live as God intends, to be in right relationship with God's creation which of course includes ourselves and other people. Central to God's desire for us is kindness (one of the twelve fruits of the Holy Spirit) and an ability to empathise, to consider the view or experience of another.

At school we talk lots about the expectation that we have for all of our students to use "kind hands, kind words, and kind feet". Another expectation we often talk about but sometimes less directly than the first is to be in the right place at the right time doing the right thing. I'd be grateful if you would please reinforce these expectations at home using language like "At school everyone is expected to…".

Today our teaching staff is using training material provided by the Ministry of Education to look more closely at Te Mātaiaho, the refreshed New Zealand Curriculum (Te Mātaiaho means "to observe and examine the strands of learning" - this name was gifted by Dr Wayne Ngata and the members of the MOE Rōpū Kaitiaki). The Ministry is three years into a six-year programme to refresh The New Zealand Curriculum - schools and kura have until the beginning of 2027 to start using the fully refreshed curriculum, although they must use the refreshed mathematics and statistics and English learning areas from the start of 2025. To support the New Zealand Curriculum Refresh implementation, Te Marautanga o Aotearoa redesign, and the NCEA Change Programme, the Ministry of Education assigned four additional teacher-only days for primary and secondary schools - two in 2023 and two in 2024. Schools and kura have been instructed to select a date for a teacher-only day that best suits their activity planning across a two-week defined time-period, one in Term 2 and the other in Term 4. Again, my sincere thanks for your support in making days like today successful for our school community.



What is Trinity Sunday?

Trinity Sunday is the day we celebrate the truth that God is made up of the Father, the Son (Jesus) and the Holy Spirit. The bible tells us that there is only one God but that this God is made up of three parts, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. The word we use to describe this 3 in 1 God is "Trinity." 
