NUT FREE SCHOOL REMINDER

Remember please that we are a nut-free school. Children who suffer from nut allergies can develop a severe, potentially life-threatening allergic reaction. For some with a nut allergy it is not just eating the nuts that can cause a severe reaction, just being touched on the skin or smelling the breath of someone who has nuts or a product containing nuts can trigger anaphylactic shock (which can cause breathing and swallowing difficulties).

We cannot have nuts in school in any form. For example, Peanut butter sandwiches, Chocolate spreads, Cereal bars, Cakes/biscuits that contain nuts, Anything containing satay, Sauces containing nuts.

Please check the packaging of all products before giving them to your child to bring to school. We appreciate that this is an additional thing to check, but we know you understand the importance of it. If you have any questions, please contact the school.

HEAD LICE

Unfortunately there have been several cases of head lice in our school. Would you kindly check your child's hair regularly and treat it if necessary to reduce the risk of spread.

Unless all parents attend to this the spread is ongoing and we will not be able to stop re-infection.

If your child's hair is long, please make it a practice to ensure it is tied back, in accordance with the uniform guidelines.


